As part of mobility week 2010 the City of Stockholm invites you to take part in two inspiring workshops about young thinking on future transport and sustainable travel.

Day 1, September 21st

Workshop: Young thinking on future transport

The challenge of expanding cities must be addressed against a background of measures to achieve the goal of reduced greenhouse gas emissions. Stockholm is one of the fastest growing regions in Scandinavia, working hard to meet the challenge. During our year as the first European Green Capital (2010), extra focus will be put on disseminating our methods and achievements in this work.

One method used by traffic planners in the city of Stockholm is involving students in the development and design of new ideas. In the "Smart Transport" project, students have been invited to suggest transport solutions for the future – based on their own experiences of shortcomings in today's transport system.

In this workshop, selected student projects about future transport solutions for Stockholm will be presented as a basis for a discussion during which important issues concerning sustainable transport in cities will be highlighted.

Workshop: Sustainable travel

Stockholm is one of the fastest growing regions in Scandinavia. The challenges which this presents must be addressed while at the same we must achieve the goal of reducing greenhouse gas emissions.

The growing population increases the demand for the development of denser residential areas with good road and public transport connections. The purpose is to make travel between home, work, school and leisure facilities straight forward.

The City of Stockholm has arranged an exciting programme of speakers from the Traffic Administration, the City Planning Administration and Stockholm Public Transport to share with you how we are planning for sustainable transport. During the panel discussion there will be an opportunity to share how important issues are being handled, including:

- What do we need to do to give pedestrians higher status and priority?
- How can we encourage more people to cycle?
- How can we improve the public transport experience?
- Strategies for improving information provision.
- How can we make people feel safer when choosing public transport, walking or cycling?
- Strategies for reducing car use.

Following the workshops there will be an opportunity to take part in study visits.
